## Rationale

Increasing urban population and growing urbanization is posing a serious public health challenge to the leadership of the country as the access to basic services of health care and health determinants is becoming an important indicator of urban governance.

Health in urban areas has played a pivotal function in shaping flight of Demographic growth and Economic triumph of community and individual well-being across the history. However, the Dynamic relationship between health and urban space is always changing and in return changing the urban landscape of the cities. Lately the improvement of better preventive and curative medical care in cities leads to lower mortality than their surrounding areas. Increasing urban population and growing urbanization is posing a serious public health challenge to the leadership of the country as the access to basic services of health care and health determinants is becoming an important indicator of urban governance.

Apathy towards urban health has led to limited reach of poor to quality health care services. Moreover, the multiple stakeholders operating in urban settings lead to weak coordination and convergence of urban poor and urban basic infrastructure services. Healthy cities cannot be built without systematically addressing the vulnerability of urban population. WHO Healthy Cities programme is also emphasizing on addressing equity and the social determinants of health through integrative policy making and planning. The recent initiatives of AMRUT and Smart cities are the way forward for the Smart and Healthy urban life.

In view of the above, this course is designed to train the participants, in capacity building for managing the city/urban areas efficiently and effectively.

## Objective

To build competency for professional working in urban health to develop, implement and strategize urban health programme in implementation of NUHM and address challenges, thereof.

## Participation Fee :

**INR 21,000 (Residential) & INR 16500 (Non-residential) for Indian participants**

**USD 780 (Residential) & USD 550 (Non-residential) for foreign participants.**

**Group Discount:** Any organization sponsoring four or more participants to the program will be entitled to a discount of 20% on total fee payable provided that at least four participants attend the programme.

**Maximum Discount:** Organizations can avail themselves of both the discounts subjects to a maximum discount of 20%.
