Rationale

This specialized knowledge helps to assess a project's performance and its lasting impact. Project managers and program evaluators are needed in nearly every sector, viz. the government, corporate world, development, and the nonprofit sector. The MDP from International Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR), Delhi provides participants with critical skillset necessary to design and implement program-based Monitoring and Evaluation to make a difference within the sector and to strengthen the capacity of development professionals

The proposed level program will present the fundamentals of monitoring and Evaluation of development projects with practical application of concepts and methods. This program will provide participants with tools, techniques and resources needed for designing, planning, organizing, monitoring, and evaluating development projects.

Objective

To build leadership and management competency in monitoring and evaluation for professional working in government organization, development organization, NGOs and private organizations

Outcome

At the end of this program, the participants/professional will be able to:

- Design the M & E system needed for effective implantation of development program
- Understand concept of monitoring and evaluation and develop the monitoring and evaluation plan of project
- Design Process Monitoring, Quality Assessment, Process Evaluation, Output and Outcome Monitoring, Outcome, and Impact Evaluation
- Determine the sample size for study design
- Develop a monitoring and evaluation framework
- Draft measurable project goals, outcomes, objectives, and activities of project
- Develop and utilize appropriate indicators for measuring project or program goals, outcomes, outputs, and impacts/effectiveness
- Understand quantitative and qualitative methods and ability to use them in program Monitoring and evaluation and select the most appropriate data collection method for a given situation

Participation Fee :

Residential participants is INR 35,000/- plus 18 % GST. This include tuition free, course study material, training Kit, certificates, field visit, accommodation on twin sharing basis (breakfast, lunch and dinner) and local hospitality at IIHMR Delhi.

Non- residential participants is INR 27,500/- plus 18 % GST. This include tuition fee, course study material, training Kit, certificates, field visit, lunch.
